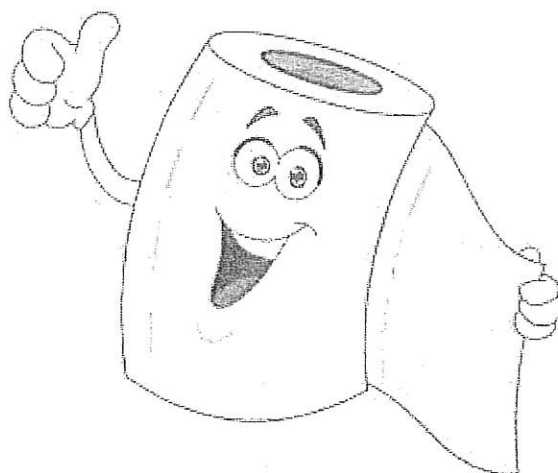
# Ready for Kindergarten

# TOILETING EXPECTATIONS FOR KINDERGARTEN

Your child should:

- Recognize when they need to go to the bathroom and be able to ask to go
- Wear underwear under their clothing
- Know how to pull down their own underwear and pants
- Be able to sit on or stand to use the toilet/urinal
- Wipe themselves without assistance with toilet paper
- Pull up their pants and underwear
- Wash their hands



We understand that occasional accidents may happen. Please remember to provide an extra set of underwear and clothing in a labeled bag to keep in your child's classroom for emergencies.

REMINDER: The school nurse will call the parent/guardian to pick up their child if it is a bowel movement accident. Teachers do not change their students.
